

Update on Proposed Water Treatment Facility

Twin Oaks Valley Community Sponsor Group • June 16, 2004 • 6:30 p.m.

The San Diego County Water Authority will provide an update about its proposed regional water treatment plant to the Twin Oaks Valley Community Sponsor Group on June 16, 2004 at 6:30 p.m. The sponsor group meets at Twin Oaks High School, at 158 Cassou Rd.

The presentation will include information that community members requested at the April 21, 2004, sponsor group meeting. The project team will bring:

- sound levels and photographs of two water treatment plants
- information on chemicals needed to treat water to drinking water standards
- an update on the Water Authority board of directors' decision-making process for this project
- next steps and community involvement opportunities

The proposed water treatment facility would produce enough treated water to meet the annual needs of up to 220,000 typical households in San Diego County. If approved, it would be constructed next to

other Water Authority facilities on Twin Oaks Valley Road. Construction could begin as early as 2006 and be complete in 2008.

At its June 24 meeting the Water Authority board of directors is expected to add this project to the Capital Improvement Program budget. Members of the public are welcome to attend board meetings, held at 4677 Overland Ave. in San Diego. The project will not be approved for construction until an environmental impact report is completed in 2005.
