

Geotechnical Work at Twin Oaks Valley Water Treatment Plant Site

The San Diego County Water Authority will be conducting geotechnical work at the site of the proposed Twin Oaks Valley Water Treatment Plant site from **Thursday, Feb. 10 to Friday, Feb. 18**. Work hours will be **7 a.m. to 5 p.m.** The work will be performed by Allied Geotechnical, a Water Authority contractor, and includes core sample drilling with a drill rig, test pit excavations and seismic surveys. The number of workers will range from 3 to 7 per day.

This work is needed to gather additional geological data about the site for the three teams preparing proposals for the project. The data will help the teams more accurately design and budget the plant in their design-build-operate proposals.

The proposed water treatment plant

A new regional water treatment plan is needed to meet current and future needs for treated water in San Diego County, partially during warm months when demand for water soars. The proposed Twin Oaks Valley Water Treatment Plant will produce 100-million gallons of water per day, enough to meet the needs of up to 220 typical households. It is slated for construction beginning 2006 and to begin operating in 2008.
