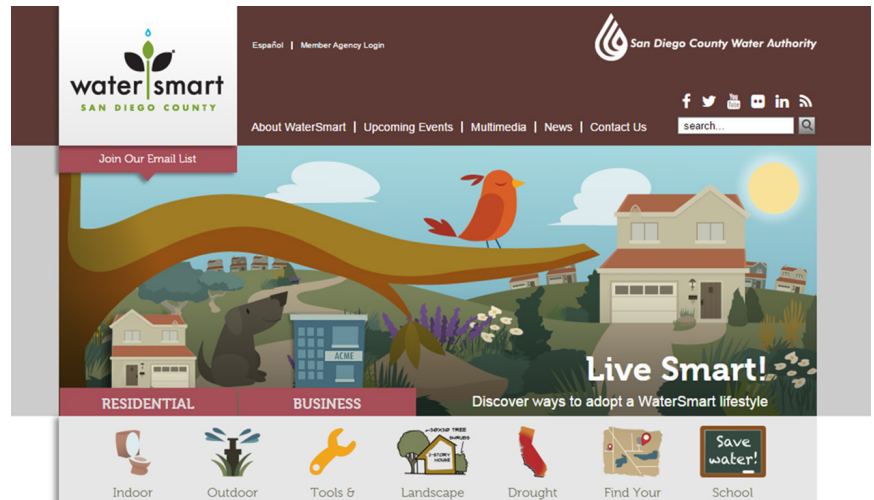

### SDG&E Programs

## INCENTIVES, PROGRAMS & CLASSES

### Sustainable Landscapes Program

Homeowners may qualify for up to \$1.75 per square foot for replacing water-intensive turf grass with sustainable landscaping. Eligible projects must include rainwater capture and detention, soil enhancements, climate-appropriate plants and high-efficiency irrigation. Funding is limited. ### WaterSmart Checkups

Free WaterSmart Checkups are a great opportunity to receive site-specific recommendations for saving water from certified irrigation professionals. ### WaterSmart Landscape Makeover Program

Learn how to upgrade your landscape by replacing high-water-use turf with beautiful, low-water options by taking advantage of free resources:

- Landscape Makeover Series – This four-class series coached by local landscape professionals focuses on each participant's landscape to create actionable designs, planting and irrigation plans to turn turf areas into gardens that thrive in San Diego County's climate.
- Design for Homeowners Workshop – A three-hour version of the four-class makeover series.

### Artificial Turf Discount Program

To help bring down the cost of replacing water-incentive grass with artificial turf, residents can get a 10 percent discount on artificial turf products and services directly from participating companies. For more information go to [WaterSmartSD.org](http://WaterSmartSD.org).



## REBATES

The following rebates are provided through SoCal Water\$mart, a region-wide program that offers rebates for devices that improve water-use efficiency at residential and commercial properties. Funding is limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. [Go to SoCalWaterSmart.com](http://Go to SoCalWaterSmart.com) for more information.

### High-Efficiency Clothes Washer Rebates

Southern California residents may qualify for rebates starting at \$85 for the purchase of a high-efficiency clothes washer from a list of qualified products. An additional rebate may be available from San Diego Gas & Electric. Go to [sdge.com](http://sdge.com) for more information. High-efficiency washers, known as HEWs, use 45 percent less water and 25 percent less energy than conventional clothes washers.

### Premium High-Efficiency Toilet Rebates

Homeowners may qualify for rebates starting at \$40 for purchasing 1.1 gallons per flush premium high-efficiency toilets from the list of qualified products. Toilets account for nearly 30 percent of a typical home's indoor water use.

### Rotating Irrigation Nozzle Rebates

Rebates up to \$2 each are available for rotating nozzles, which reduce runoff and water waste by using 20 percent less water than conventional spray heads. Participants must buy at least 30 nozzles from the list of qualified products to be eligible for rebates.

### Residential Smart Controller Rebates

Approved weather-based irrigation controllers are eligible for rebates starting at \$80 per controller for landscapes less than one acre and \$35 per station for larger landscapes.

### Residential Rain Barrel and Cistern Rebates

Rebates are available for up to \$35 per rain barrel (maximum two rebates per residence) or \$250-\$350 for a cistern depending on capacity. Rain barrels and cisterns collect water from gutters and downspouts for use on landscapes, while reducing irrigation needs and the amount of water flowing into storm drains.

### Soil Moisture Sensor System Rebates

Soil moisture sensors measure the amount of water in the active root zones. Eligible soil moisture sensor systems include a sensor and a calibrator (typically packaged in the same device) and an irrigation controller. Rebates start at \$80 for a single soil moisture sensor system for landscapes less than one acre and \$35 per irrigation station for larger sites.

### Property Assessed Clean Energy Program

PACE program financing allows property owners to fund qualified water efficiency projects with little or no up-front costs. Properties located within participating cities or unincorporated areas of San Diego County may be able to finance up to 100% of their project and pay it back over time through property tax bills.
