

Lake Hodges Projects Update

Clearing and Site Preparation Work to Begin in January 2005



Dear Resident or Property Owner,

Work on the Lake Hodges Projects will begin soon. The first week of January 2005, the San Diego County Water Authority will begin clearing and preparing two areas: one area will be the future site of the pump station and pipeline tunnel portal, and the other site, near the former aquatic sports (windsurfing) rental facility, will serve as a staging area for future construction.

Following site clearance and preparation, SDG&E will begin to lay the foundation for the power transmission line poles. Pole installation and extension of existing power lines will be completed by July 2005.

During site clearance operations, you may experience some noise, dust or minimal construction traffic in the area. The Water Authority will work closely with the community to monitor and minimize any of these inconveniences.

The Lake Hodges Projects are part of the Emergency Storage Project, a system of reservoirs, interconnected pipelines and pumping stations designed to make water available to communities in the San Diego region in the event of an interruption in imported water deliveries.
