East End Of Clairemont Mesa Boulevard To Close

The parking area and trailhead at the east end of Clairemont Mesa Boulevard, east of Rueda Drive, will close to public access the week of December 8 to begin work on the San Diego County Water Authority's Mission Trails Project. The east end of Clairemont Mesa Boulevard will be the primary project access point for construction vehicles and will host five construction field office trailers (see graphic).

The contractor's work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday. The project is scheduled to be complete in mid-2011.

Park Trail Access

Access to Mission Trails Regional Park at the east end of Clairemont Mesa Boulevard will be completely closed from December 2008 through the end of January 2009. The closure will allow the bridge to be repaired from fire damage so it can safely hold heavy trucks and equipment accessing the project.



Fortunately, after the bridge repairs, recreational trail access to the park from Clairemont Mesa Boulevard will be partially reopened during construction. Access along the sidewalk to the north of Clairemont Mesa Boulevard will be allowed on Sundays and before 7 a.m. and after 7 p.m. most other days.

Other trails in the western portion of the park will also begin to be closed, as construction progresses. Alternative trail access locations can be found off of Corte Playa Catalina and Calle de Vida in Tierrasanta.

The Mission Trails Project will upgrade critical water pipelines running beneath western portions of Mission Trails Regional Park, improving water reliability and increasing the amount of water delivered to treatment plants serving the central and south sections of the county.
