

# REVISED DUE TO A CHANGE IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO'S OCTOBER SCHEDULE

## San Vicente Reservoir Update Weekday Closure to Begin October 1

**Starting October 1, 2007 through April 30, 2008, San Vicente Reservoir will be closed on weekdays due to Emergency Storage Project construction activities.**

**For the month of October, fishing and water contact activities will be allowed on Saturdays and only water contact activities will be allowed on Sundays.**

The city of San Diego's winter schedule will begin November 1, 2007, which allows fishing activities only on Saturdays and Sundays. The reservoir is planned to be closed everyday starting mid- to late-2008 to raise the height of San Vicente Dam. The reservoir will reopen to recreation sometime between 2014 and 2017, as soon as the water level reaches the new boat launch.

The Emergency Storage Project is creating new emergency water storage and pipeline connections, to enable water to continue to flow throughout the region even if our imported water supply is disrupted.
